CASE MANAGEMENT FOR ADULTS

The case management program for adults with serious mental illness and/or mental retardation or developmental disabilities provides assistance in locating resources, independent becoming more and overcoming challenges of living in the community. Some services include:

- Assisting in finding medical, social, educational, religious and other services needed
- Providing information on employment, housing, and recreational/leisure opportunities in the community
- Involving the individual in making important decisions based on strengths and wishes
- Helping the individual feel better about self as he/she begins making choices and meeting personal goals

An individual will be assigned a case manager. This professional will be collegeeducated with knowledge in mental health or mental retardation related fields and will have the individual's needs and interests in mind. It is up to the individual to tell the case manager of personal goals and the community resources he/she wants to use. The ultimate goal of case management is to help gain the highest level of independence and personal growth possible.

CASE MANAGEMENT FOR CHILDREN

Case managers for children with serious emotional disorders and/or mental retardation or developmental disabilities work both with the individual child and the child's family in providing the following services:

- Assessing the child's needs and determining the resources required to address those needs
- Developing an individual service plan for accessing and using resources that can meet identified needs based on the child's and family's strengths
- Linking the child with community services and supports identified in the service plan
- Monitoring the child's progress as it • relates to the child's service plan in the home, school, and community

Case managers work with children and their families in identifying and overcoming any obstacles that limit the child's opportunities for success. Children are assigned one case manager, a professional with at least a fouryear college degree in a mental health or mental retardation related field. The goal of case management is to help children and their families gain access to needed community services and supports.
