Best Practice for Interviewing the Patient (REL-CHC-0-BPIP)

Severe mental illness (SMI) and substance use disorders (SUD) can be challenging for someone experiencing symptoms. It can also be challenging for that individual's family members who may have little knowledge about behavioral health, are often not included in treatment, and may not have access to information on how to understand, communicate, or intervene with a loved one experiencing severe symptoms. There is ample evidence that the inclusion of families in treatment planning and recovery management achieves the best outcomes. **Credit Hours: 1**

Ethical Decision-Making (REL-HHS-0-EDM-V2)

As a clinical health professional, you must make ethical decisions on a regular basis. In this course, you will be introduced to the concept of ethics and standards of conduct that relate to clinical health professionals. The main goal of this course is to teach you how to identify situations where ethical challenges are common, as well as how to incorporate a few different ethical decision-making models into those challenges.
